F 0880  <b>Level of harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm</b>  <b>Residents Affected - Many</b>	<p><b>Provide and implement an infection prevention and control program.</b></p> <p>Based on observation, interview, and record review, the facility failed to maintain an infection prevention and control program designed to provide a safe, sanitary and comfortable environment and to help prevent the development and transmission of communicable diseases and infections. - DA D was observed preparing food in the kitchen with a mask down around her chin - DA E was observed preparing food in the kitchen with a mask not covering her nose. - CNA C was observed not wearing a mask while sitting at the nursing station - RN A was observed not wearing a mask while sitting at the nursing station - LVN B was observed not wearing a mask while sitting at the nursing station These failures have the potential to affect residents by placing them at an increased and unnecessary risk of exposure to communicable diseases and infections. Findings include: During an observation of the kitchen on 9-4-2020 at 10:30 AM, DA D was seen with her mask down around her chin. The mask was not covering her nose and mouth as she was preparing food. During an observation of the kitchen on 9-4-2020 at 10:30 AM, DA E was seen preparing food with her mask down not covering her nose. During an observation on 9-4-2020 at 12:56 PM, CNA C was seen with her face mask down around her chin while sitting at the nurse's station. During an observation on 9-4-2020 at 1:05 PM both RN A was observed not wearing a face mask at all while sitting at a nurse's station. LVN B was seen sitting at the same nurse's station with her mask down around her chin. During an interview with KM on 9-4-2020 at 10:40 AM, she was asked if it was her expectation that all her kitchen staff wear masks while working in the kitchen. KM replied that it was her expectation that all staff wear their masks while in the kitchen. KM was asked if it was her expectation that all kitchen staff wear their masks to cover both their nose and mouths. KM confirmed that it was her expectation that all staff wear their masks to cover their nose and mouths. During an interview with DA D on 9-4-2020 at 10:44 AM, DA D was asked why she was not wearing her mask correctly when the surveyor entered the kitchen. DA D replied that she was hot. DA D confirmed that she knew that it was required to wear a mask while working in the kitchen. DA D was asked what problems could arise if she was not wearing a mask while preparing food. DA D stated that she could get people sick. During an interview with DA E on 9-4-2020 at 10:47 AM, DA E was asked why she was not covering her nose with her mask. DA E replied that it slipped down. DA E was asked if it was the expectation to wear a mask that covered both her nose and mouth while working in the kitchen, and she responded that it was the expectation. During an interview with ADM, DON and ADON on 9-4-2020 at 10:53 AM, they were all asked if it was their expectation to wear a mask while in the building. All confirmed that it was the expectation that staff wear a mask while in the facility. During an interview on 9-4-2020 at 1:07 PM, DON and ADON were asked if it was their expectation that nursing staff wear masks while at the nurse's station. Both DON and ADON replied that it was their expectation to wear a mask while in the building. ADON confirmed the importance of wearing a mask was to help prevent the spread of COVID 19 or other infections. During an interview on 9-4-2020 at 1:13 PM, LVN B was asked why she was not wearing a mask at the nurse's station. She replied that it slipped down. LVN B confirmed that masks were being worn to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and that it was the facility's expectation to wear a mask while working. During an interview on 9-4-2020 at 1:15 PM, RN A was asked why she was not wearing a mask while sitting at the nurse's station. She stated that she had polio when younger and it affected her lungs. During an interview on 9-4-2020 at 1:58 PM, CNA C was asked why she was not wearing a mask while sitting at the nurse's desk. CNA C stated that she sometimes just gets tired of the mask and takes it off. CNA C was asked why facility staff were required to wear a mask while working. She stated it was to help stop the spread of COVID. Record review of facility provided policy titled COVID-19 Response Plan dated 8-27-2020, reflected in part: E. HYGIENE AT WORK Wear masks. F. KEEP THE MANOR CLEAN Wear masks. Record review of Executive Order GA 29, dated 7-2-2020, reflected in part: NOW, THEREFORE, I, Greg Abbott, Governor of Texas, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, do hereby order the following on a statewide basis effective at 12:01 p.m. on July 3, 2020: Every person in Texas shall wear a face covering over the nose and mouth when inside a commercial entity or other building or space open to the public, or when in an outdoor public space, wherever it is not feasible to maintain six feet of social distancing from another person not in the same household; Record review of Nursing Facility COVID-19 Response Emergency Rule, not dated, reflected in part: (k) All nursing facility staff must wear facemasks while in the facility. (m) If an executive order or other direction is issued by the Governor of Texas, the President of the United States, or another applicable authority, that is more restrictive than this rule or any minimum standard relating to a nursing facility, the nursing facility must comply with the executive order or other direction.</p>
